This week's activities of note from the Town Manager's Office:

- Once again this week, Truro was affected by a winter storm which brought snow, winds and widespread
 power outages. Town Hall, the Community Center and Library were closed on Tuesday March 13th. DPW
 crews plowed and sanded throughout the storm and the Police and Fire Departments increased staff for
 the duration of the storm.
- Work continued this week on the Annual Town Meeting warrant. Reminder: Annual Town Meeting will be held on Tuesday April 24, 2018 at the Truro Central School.
- Staff and I met with a representative from the firm that is analyzing the Town's Health Care expenses.
- The Shared Services Study is nearly complete, we will have a formal presentation of findings and recommendations at an upcoming Board of Selectmen meeting.

Department News:

Department of Public Works

- The Transfer Station will be closed Easter Sunday, April 1, 2108.
- Ballston Beach parking lot cleanup has been completed. The parking lot will remain closed until further notice.
- The foundation for the commercial hauler scale has been completed and backfilled. Scale assembly will begin Monday. The traffic pattern will temporarily be changed while under construction. Due to the extreme weather conditions last weekend the completion date has been pushed back to April 16, 2018.
- DPW Director Cabral has scheduled a meeting for next Tuesday at 1:00 pm with the Army Corps of Engineers for an update regarding the Pamet River Restoration project.
- Next week we have tentatively scheduled a drone flight that will cover the area between Ballston
 Beach and Pamet Harbor. Our goal is to map storm water inundation using still pictures and video to
 create a GIS map which will help the town visualize where inundation has, or is, occurring from the
 March 2018 storms. In addition, we will be utilizing advanced data processing (2D/3D)
 Photogrammetry to map terrain, inundation pathways, and map well and septic systems. The Army
 Corps has agreed to assist with overlaying the locations of well and septic locations onto what data we
 gather from the drone flight.
- DPW Director Cabral has scheduled a meeting with the Woods Hole Group for April 5 for an update regarding East Harbor. Our hope is to solidify the scope of work for the seaward end construction, and to continue the discussion on the overall project.
- The Competitive Green Community Grant application has been submitted for FY 2019. We are requesting a total of \$149,000 in grant funding in support of the Truro Central School boiler replacement.

• Longnook Beach will remain closed. DPW Director Cabral, Health and Conservation Agent Beebe, and Beach and Recreation Director Clements have discussed, and immediately addressed, safety concerns due to erosion.

Harbor Master

- Harbor Master met with DEP, Wellfleet and Provincetown Harbormasters to discuss using Pamet Harbor on April 18th for training on oil spills and how to contain them. Also in attendance were the Fire Chief and Coast Guard, and a representative from the National Seashore.

 officials prior to the oil spill exercise. The Fire Chief will help coordinate the many people who will be
 participating.
