• Town Offices Adding More In-Person Service Hours

Town Hall is now open to the public Tuesdays through Fridays from 8 am to 4 pm. Town Hall will remain closed to the public on Mondays, but will continue to provide virtual, remote and online services. The Public Library offers browsing and other library services for the public from 12 pm to 6 pm on Tuesday and Thursday and from 10 am to 4 pm on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. Contactless pickup continues to be available.

The Community Center is open for in-person programming and appointments to the public Tuesdays through Fridays from 8 am to 4 pm but are available by phone and email on Mondays.

Masks are required in all public buildings until further notice.

Masks are no longer required outdoors on Town property.

This week's activities of note from the Town Manager's Office:

- The Emergency Management Team convened in advance of Tropical Storm Elsa's arrival. Emergency
 Management Director Collins provided the team with updates as models changed and coordinated with
 Eversource. Public safety staffing was increased and DPW pre-positioned assets around town and at the
 beaches. Recreation & Beach and Counsel on Aging adjusted their programs due to the storm. High winds
 may continue through this evening.
- Town Staff prepared the first official orientation for new Select Board members. Department Heads and I
 presented information to the incoming Select Board members regarding departmental organization,
 budgets, and challenges and opportunities. We look forward to continuing this in the future for incoming
 Select Board members.

Assessing

- Beginning July 1, 2021, the Assessor's Office will begin accepting applications for the Residential and Statutory Exemptions for the Fiscal Year 2022.
- If you are already receiving the Residential Exemption, there is no need to reapply. The Assessor's Office will notify you if requirements are not met.
- All Statutory Exemptions (Senior, Veterans, Blind, etc.) must reapply annually, and applications will be mailed out next week to recent Statutory Exemption recipients.
- Applications received by August 31, 2021 will receive reductions on the October Tax Bill.
