I am unable to attend the Zoning Board meeting today. Could you ask them to read this into the public comment?

Out of a community of 150 homes in Pond Village, they got 77 signatures on his letter. We can assume most are two-person households and then being generous we can assume he is only representing 50 homes or 1/3 of the population, certainly not all. What I want to know, and seems to be left out all of the time is, how many of the 150 homes have Title 5 Septic Systems? How many of those systems have been pumped and/or inspected in the last 5 years? How many Cesspools are there in the neighborhood? I think, before we can access blame and shame on a project 1 mile away we should look at exactly what is happening in their own neighborhood.

Believe me, I want our water source protected but the Cloverleaf project septic system is already the latest technology providing us with the best protection possible. Any home still utilizing a Cesspool is doing far more contamination than the Cloverleaf will ever do. An inventory should be easy to produce.
